I would firstly like to acknowledge the Traditional Owners of all the Lands on which we'll meet over the coming days and pay my respects to the Elders past, present and emerging. I would also like to extend a special welcome to all First Nations peoples who will be either participating in the Junior State Titles, or supporting from the sidelines.

On the back of a very successful Senior State Titles event a number of weeks back, this weekend – after two years of cancellation as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic – the Junior State Titles are making their long-awaited return.

Given this is the largest grassroots netball event on the Netball NSW calendar, I think it's fair to say that netball is back! How good is it to be able to say that?

Absence certainly makes the heart grow fonder and I know we are in for three very special days as participants and fans from all over the state flock in their thousands to both venues.

Before I continue, I would like to acknowledge the players, coaches, officials, volunteers, staff and wider supporters of the game who put so much effort into their Junior State Title campaigns in both 2020 and 2021, only to have their opportunities taken away as the nation grappled with the coronavirus.

I hope many of those affected are taking part this year, but those who aren't should still be immensely proud of their achievement in being selected for representative netball in the first place. When you see the sheer power of our grassroots game, that is no mean feat.

This weekend Penrith plays host to teams contesting Divisions 1 and 2 of the 14U, 13U and 12U age groups, while Baulkham Hills welcomes players in Divisions 3 and 4 of the same categories.

Excitingly, for the first time ever, we will have a Boys Division. A few weeks ago, we saw Ku-ring-gai crowned the first-ever Men's Senior State Titles Opens champions in what was a key – and long overdue – development for our sport in NSW.

A frontrunner in terms of playing numbers when it comes to community sport, netball has long been recognised as the leading team sport for women and young girls, as well as the standout leader in high-performance space for the same demographic

However, as part of Netball Australia's State of the Game Review, a compelling case was made for netball to be more inclusive in many areas including gender.

The inclusion of male divisions in the Junior and Senior State Titles – the sport's showpiece events at grassroots level – is a vital part of securing our game's future by ensuring it is a safe space for all.

Of course, this weekend doesn't happen by accident.

As anyone who attends our State Titles can attest to, a huge amount of work goes into staging such large-scale events and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many volunteers at both Penrith and Baulkham Hills, as well as the Team at Netball NSW, for their efforts.

I would also like to acknowledge that this year Penrith celebrate their 50th anniversary, and it is apt for them to be a host Association in 2022 given their immense contribution to the game in this state.

I would also like to thank HART Sport, our Junior State Titles naming rights partner, for all of their continued support of netball in this state.

While I am sure we'll have some future NSW Swifts, GIANTS and Australian Diamonds hitting the courts over the coming days, I think the most important aspect of this weekend is for everyone to enjoy the experience.

The last few years have shown us nothing is ever certain so we should appreciate the collectiveness events like this bring, and powerful impact netball can have across NSW.




Venue Covid plan

There are currently no venue restrictions limiting numbers in and around State Titles venues, however we are aware that we are still living in a COVID-19 environment and we need to all be conscious in what we are doing to minimise the spread. fatigue, runny nose, muscle pain, joint pain, nausea/vomiting, diarrhoea, loss of appetite or other flu symptoms.



Recommendations

Netball NSW recommends the implementation of the following risk management strategies;

- Participants complete a RAT prior to departing for State Titles or on the morning of day one.
- Participants self-isolate and get tested for COVID-19 if they feel unwell.
- Participants who test positive for COVID-19 should not participate in State Titles and should abide by all Public Health Orders in relation to self-isolating.
- Non-sharing of drink bottles or food.
- · Promoting hand-washing and sanitising.
- Wearing of face masks on transport and in other places where it is difficult to social distance.
- Ice baths or the sharing of any untreated bath style tub is not permitted on site at Junior State Titles.

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

Match Length

Games will consist of 2×12 minute halves. There will be a 2 minute break at half time, and a 4 minute break between rounds.

COMPETITION RULES

The Junior State Titles Competition Rules are available to view and download from the <u>Junior State Titles</u> page of the Netball NSW website.

Late Registrations and De-Registrations

The Late Registrations and De-Registrations can be submitted via the link on the <u>Junior State Titles page</u> of the Netball NSW website.

Late Registrations and De-Registrations must be received by 8:00am on the first day of play.

Forms can be submitted via the late registrations and De-registrations link from Friday 24 June 2022 or handed to Event Control at Junior State Titles before 8am on Saturday 2 July 2022, for approval and processing.

A team may late register a maximum of four (4) players. De-Registration of players is also permitted at this time, however following the close of entries, players listed on the original team entry are not permitted to De-Register and Re-Register with another Association.

A team must still consist of a maximum of twelve (12) players and a minimum of seven (7) players.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

In the case of inclement weather, a decision shall be made at 7:30am each morning as to whether play will commence for the day.

Netball NSW will refer to the Netball NSW Adverse Weather Conditions Policy which is available to view and download on the Policies & Forms page of the Netball NSW website.

Please note: Umbrellas are not permitted between courts under any circumstances. This is to ensure player and umpire safety.

PLAYER MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS (40% RULE)

- All players in all age groups must play a minimum of 40% of the total number of available games over the Junior State Titles (40% rule).
- For the benefit of doubt refer to the table below to determine how many matches equates to 40% for each division at Junior State Titles.
- For the purposes of calculation of the '40% rule', two half games equals one full game.
- Where a player is unavailable for games for a medical reason, a medical certificate from a registered Medical practitioner or Physiotherapist or the on-site medic should be submitted with the 40% recording sheet.
- Where the release is provided by the Netball NSW appointed on-site medics a release slip will be completed that can be submitted with the Player match recording form.
- If your own Association appointed Physio or other medical practitioner is providing a medical certificate then this must be provided on their own letterhead.
- 40% of games will be determined from the games the player was available for.

ie: if a player is ruled out for only 2 games of a total of the 19 games by a medical officer, then the 40% rule will be taken from only the 17 games that they are available to play.

 For the full outline of the Player Minimum requirement rule, as taken from the Junior State Titles Competition rules and includes information in relation to disputes, please see the attached extract of clause 4.4.

ATHLETES VILLAGE / TENTS

ATHLETES VILLAGE ACCESS

- The Athletes Village cannot be accessed prior to 6am on any day of the competition.
- Netball NSW recommends that team tents are a designated space for players and team officals only.
- Cooking and heating of any type is NOT permitted in the Athlete Village area (inside and outside of tents)
- Please place rubbish at the end of each day in the bins provided.
- An audit will be conducted at the end of the competition and if rubbish isn't removed, a cleaning fee of \$500 will be charged to the hirer.

ICE BATHS

Ice baths are not permitted at Junior State Titles.

FOOD

 It is recommended that all food being served to Players is provided in individual packaging.


SPECTATOR TENTS

 Spectator tents must not be erected outside of the designated Spectator Tent Area (please refer to venue map)

- There is NO cooking permitted inside any spectator tents.
- Cooking is only permitted outside of tents and this must be a distance of 2 metres away from the tents but still within the spectator tent area.
- There is NO access to the spectator tent area before 6.00am on any day of the competition - NO EXCEPTIONS
- All spectator tents that have been bought to the venue will have to be dismantled and removed from the venue each day.
- If in the resonable opinion of Netball NSW staff, there are tents which have been errected in the spectator area that are deemed to be a risk factor (due to prevailing weather conditions or other events) Netball NSW staff will arrange to have these tents dismantled.
- · Generators are not permitted

Tents ordered through Festival Hire

- Please place rubbish at the end of each day in the bins provided.
- An audit will be conducted at the end of each day of Spectator tents, and if rubbish isn't removed, a cleaning fee of \$500 will be charged to the hirer.



MANAGER INFORMATION

MANAGERS MEETING

A Managers meeting will immediately follow the Opening Ceremony at the stage area.

TEAM BAGS

Each team will receive a team bag. This bag will include a ball, fixtures, court map, scoresheets and information from our Commercial Partners.

Bags will be available for collection from Event Control on Day 1 of the competition.

SCORESHEETS

One scoresheet per match should be completed.

The score should be circled at Half Time and Full Time for each team.

The scorer from each team must sign the scoresheet. Once the scoresheet has been signed by BOTH scorers, the score is official and can't be adjusted.

The scorer from the Winning team is to return the completed scoresheet to Event Control.

SPECTATOR BEHAVIOUR

Participating associations are responsible for ensuring their spectators display appropriate behaviour at all times.

UMPIRE INFORMATION

Umpires with any queries throughout the competition should see Umpire Control.

If an umpire is sick on the day, please advise Umpire Control as soon as possible.

When an umpire withdraws on any day of the Titles, for other than medical reasons, extenuating circumstances

or does not show, that association will incur a \$200 fine, per allocation, per day. Medical certificates are required for any umpires that pull out due to injury or illness between now and the end of the Championships.

PHOTOGRAPHY RULES

Photography

Photographers or Videographers acting on behalf of an Association must read and sign the Netball NSW Media Accreditation Form. These forms will be available at Event control at both venues.

Spectators with a long lensed camera must also read and sign the Netball NSW Media Accreditation Form.

A lanyard will be provided to accredited Media and Association representative photographers, along with a camera tag.

No matches may be zoomed or live streamed throughout the State Tiles competition.

Please also be aware of Photography and Videography rules as per clause 6 of the Junior State Titles Competition Rules, which states:

6. Photography and Videography

In addition to the clauses outlined below, the Netball NSW Photography policy will be referred to at the Competition.

- 6.1 Extended video footage should only be taken for training purposes.
- 6.2 All photographers and videographers should notify the opposing team of their intention to photograph or video the match for consent.
- 6.3 All photographers and videographers taking photos on behalf of an Association must register with Event Control upon arrival at the Competition.
- 6.4 Photographers and Videographers may be asked to complete an accreditation form, and to wear a Netball NSW accredited photographer pass.
- 6.5 Photographers and Videographers should comply with any Courtside Equipment Guidelines published for the Competition.

GENERAL INFORMATION

FOOD

Both venues will have their canteens operating throughout the competition, along with other food vendors.

ICE

Ice is not available for purchase at the venue.

FIRST AID SERVICES

Netball NSW will provide trained medics at each of the competition venues. The medics will be located near Event Control and will be available from 7:00am each morning.

In the event of an emergency, and a Medic is not at the designated area, please see Event Control or a Netball NSW staff member.

In the event of a serious injury, Netball NSW staff will call an ambulance, under no circumstance should persons on site call Emergency Services.

ASSOCIATION PHYSIOS/INJURY REPORTING

Where Associations have their own Physiotherapist or medical person as part of their support team, an injury report form is provided in the team bags and it is requested that this is completed when treating any injury.

It is the responsibility of Associations who have their own Phyios to ensure they have all the required insurance policies and public liability.

If you are not travelling with your own team Physiotherapist, injuries should be seen by the onsite medics who will complete a full injury report.

If an ambulance is required, this will be called by a Netball NSW representative only, under no circumstance should persons on site call an Ambulance.

DOGS

Dogs are not permitted within the venue perimeter.

ALCOHOL

This event is an alcohol free event which includes in the spectator tent area.

SMOKING

A reminder that smoking is not permitted within the venue perimeter.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Announcements will be made during the day, however please be reminded that these announcements can be difficult to be heard within the Association tents, Netball NSW will endeavour to continue announcements at various times during rounds.

Inappropriate behaviour from players, officals or spectators will not be tolerated and will be dealt with in accordance with the relevant Netball NSW policy.
