Netball is a game at the heart of every community across NSW. As a leading sport of choice, we are honoured to play on the Lands of many Traditional Custodians who have cared for these Lands for 60,000 years.

Without care of Country, our game would not have thrived as it has and we are deeply grateful to the Traditional Custodians across NSW and the Nation for the care of the Lands we play on.

We pay our respects to Elders Past, Present & Emerging, and extend those respects to all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People taking part over the next three days.

On the back of record netball participation numbers in NSW and the huge successes of the recent HART Senior State Titles and the Sold-Out Suncorp Super Netball Derby between the NSW Swifts and the GIANTS, there has never been a more exciting time for our game.

This weekend a whopping 240 teams will contest the Junior State Titles. Just take a moment to let that number sink in.

As we have seen for generations, our game's workforce is well versed in putting on a spectacle but it always amazes me that despite the challenges of recent years - most notably the lost seasons to COVID-19 and washouts – netball always comes roaring back.

We are once again delighted to be hosting the Junior State Titles across the Baulkham Hills Shire and Penrith District Netball Associations.

These Associations have played a huge role in the development and evolution of the Junior State Titles (still known to many as the State Age Championships) and I would like to take moment to thank the volunteers at both Associations for their team-first ethos and can-do attitude.

Over the next three days Baulkham Hills Shire welcomes teams in the following divisions:

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

Match Length

Games will consist of 2 x 12 minute halves. There will be a 2 minute break at half time, and a 4 minute break between rounds.

Determination of Winners

The winners of each division are determined on a first past the post basis.

COMPETITION RULES

The Junior State Titles Competition Rules are available to view and download from the Junior State Titles page of the Netball NSW website.

Late Registrations and De-Registrations

Follow the Late Registrations and De-Registration instructions on the Junior State Titles page of the Netball NSW website.

Late Registrations and De-Registrations must be received by 8:00am on the first day of play.

A team may late register a maximum of four (4) players. De-Registration of players is also permitted at this time, however following the close of entries, players listed on the original team entry are not permitted to De-Register and Late Register with another Association. A team must consist of a maximum of twelve (12) players.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

In the case of inclement weather, a decision shall be made at 7:30am each morning as to whether play will commence for the day.

Netball NSW will refer to the Netball NSW Adverse Weather Conditions Policy which is available to view and download on the Policies page of the Netball NSW website.

Please note: Umbrellas are not permitted between courts under any circumstances. This is to ensure player and umpire safety.

PHOTOGRAPHY RULES

Photographers or Videographers acting on behalf of an Association must read and sign the Netball NSW Media Accreditation Form. These forms will be available at Event control at both venues.

Spectators with a long lensed camera must also read and sign the Netball NSW Media Accreditation Form.

A lanyard will be provided to accredited Media and Association representative photographers, along with a camera tag.

No matches may be live streamed throughout the State Titles competition.

Please also be aware of Photography and Videography rules as per clause 6 of the Junior State Titles Competition Rules, which states:

6. Photography and Videography

In addition to the clauses outlined below, the Netball NSW Photography policy will be referred to at the Competition.

6.1 Extended video footage should only be taken for training purposes.

6.2 All photographers and videographers should notify the opposing team of their intention to photograph or video the match for consent.

6.3 All photographers and videographers taking photos on behalf of an Association must register with Event Control upon arrival at the Competition.

6.4 Photographers and Videographers may be asked to complete an accreditation form, and to wear a Netball NSW accredited photographer pass.

6.5 Photographers and Videographers should comply with any Courtside Equipment Guidelines published for the Competition.

Think before you share

Whether it's filming your family, celebrating a big win or capturing the action, taking photos and videos are a part of sport.

But not everyone loves being in photos or videos. When taking and sharing sport snaps, remember to:

- **Follow** the Netball NSW Photography Policy, Social Media Policy and Code of Behaviour Policy.
- **Ask** if it's OK to film or photography; and
- **Respect** that not everyone wants to be online.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Food

Both venues will have their canteens operating throughout the competition, along with other food vendors.

Ice

Ice is not available for purchase at the venue.

First Aid Services

Netball NSW will provide trained medics at each of the competition venues. The medics will be located near Event Control and will be available from 7:30am each morning.

In the event of an emergency, and a Medic is not at the designated area, please see Event Control or a Netball NSW staff member.

In the event of a serious injury, Netball NSW staff will call an ambulance, under no circumstance should persons on site call Emergency Services.

Dogs

Dogs are not permitted within the venue perimeter.

Alcohol

This event is an alcohol free event which includes in the spectator tent area.

Smoking

A reminder that smoking is not permitted within the venue perimeter.

Announcements

Announcements will be made during the day, however please be reminded that these announcements can be difficult to be heard within the Association tents, Netball NSW will endeavor to continue announcements at various times during rounds.

TALENT IDENTIFICATION

During the Hart Junior State Titles, the Netball NSW Performance & Pathways team will be attending both the Baulkham Hills and Penrith venues to conduct Talent Identification for 14-year-old athletes. The goal of this process is to select a group of athletes to attend a development day, where they will have the opportunity to be further assessed for their potential within the Netball NSW athlete pathway.

This process allows us to assess the skill level of athletes and identify the attributes required to ensure NSW athletes are well-positioned for future selection into pathway programs.

We recognise that identifying talent in a large-scale event such as this presents challenges, particularly given the volume of athletes involved. We also acknowledge that this process may not always fully reflect an individual athlete's overall impact, effort, or performance within their team or association throughout the championships.

In some cases, athletes may be invited based on factors such as physical attributes or positional play that show potential for future development. These invitations are part of our commitment to exploring and nurturing talent across a wide spectrum of abilities and profiles.

MANAGER INFORMATION

Managers Meeting

A Managers meeting will be held via Teams on Monday 30th June at 7.00pm

Team Bags

Each team will receive a team bag. This bag will include a ball, fixtures, court map, scoresheets and information from our Commercial Partners.

Bags will be available for collection from Event Control on Day 1 of the competition.

Scoresheets

One scoresheet per match should be completed.

The score should be circled at Half Time and Full Time for each team.

The scorer from each team must sign the scoresheet. Once the scoresheet has been signed by BOTH scorers, the score is official and can't be adjusted.

The scorer from the Winning team is to return the completed scoresheet to Event Control.

Spectator Behaviour

Participating Associations are responsible for ensuring their spectators display appropriate behaviour at all times.

40% Recording Sheets

Each participating Association must submit the 40% recording sheet at the end of play each day for each team competing. All sheets must be accompanied by any medical forms as required.

Association Physios/Injury Reporting

Where Associations have their own Physiotherapist or medical person as part of their support team, an injury report form is provided in the team bags and it is requested that this is completed when treating any injury.

It is the responsibility of Associations who have their own Physio's to ensure they have all the required insurance policies and public liability.

If you are not travelling with your own team Physiotherapist, injuries should be seen by the onsite medics who will complete a full injury report.

If an ambulance is required, this will be called by a Netball NSW representative only, under no circumstance should persons on site call an Ambulance.

UMPIRE INFORMATION

Umpires with any queries throughout the competition should see Umpire Control.

If an umpire is sick on the day, please advise Umpire Control as soon as possible.

When an umpire withdraws on any day of the Titles, for other than medical reasons (with a certificate from the Netball NSW medics or association medical staff), extenuating circumstances or does not show, that association will incur a \$200 fine, per allocation (including reserve allocation), per day. Medical certificates are required for any umpires that pull out due to injury or illness between now and the end of the Championship.

ATHLETES VILLAGE / TENTS



Athletes Village Access

- The Athletes Village cannot be accessed prior to 6am on any day of the competition.
- Cooking and heating of any type is NOT permitted in the Athlete Village area (inside and outside of tents)
- Please place rubbish at the end of each day in the bins provided.
- An audit will be conducted at the end of the competition and if rubbish isn't removed, a cleaning fee of \$500 will be charged to the hirer.



Ice Baths

- There are no restrictions on ice baths, however access to a suitable water source on site to fill ice baths is limited and is not readily available.
- Ice baths that have been filled and left unattended will be emptied.



Food

- It is recommended that all food being served to Players is provided in individual packaging.



Spectator Tents

- Spectator tents must not be erected outside of the designated Spectator Tent Area (please refer to venue map)
- There is NO cooking permitted inside any spectator tents. Cooking is only permitted outside of tents and this must be a distance of 2 metres away from the tents but still within the spectator tent area.
- There is NO access to the spectator tent area before 6.00am on any day of the competition - NO EXCEPTIONS
- All spectator tents that have been bought to the venue will have to be dismantled and removed from the venue each day.
- If in the reasonable opinion of Netball NSW staff, there are tents which have been erected in the spectator area that are deemed to be a risk factor (due to prevailing weather conditions or other events) Netball NSW staff will arrange to have these tents dismantled.
- Generators are not permitted

Tents ordered through Festival Hire

- Please place rubbish at the end of each day in the bins provided.
- An audit will be conducted at the end of each day of Spectator tents, and if rubbish isn't removed, a cleaning fee of \$500 will be charged to the hirer.

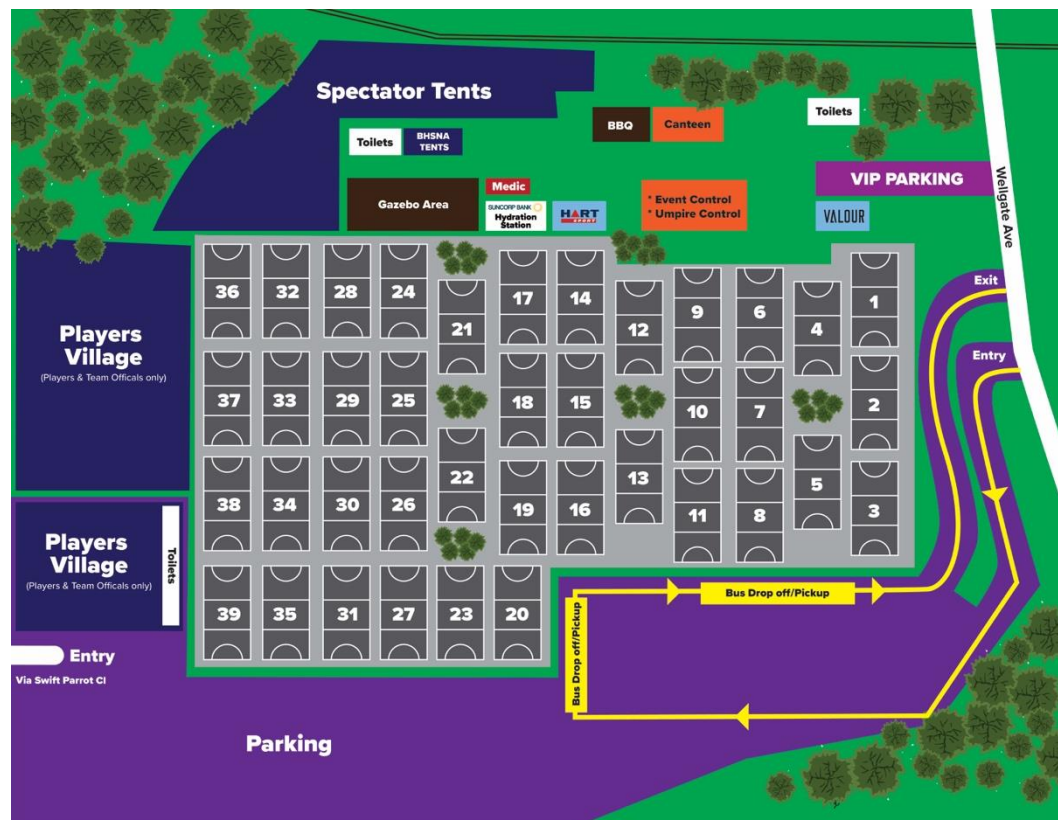

Monday - 2:30pm.

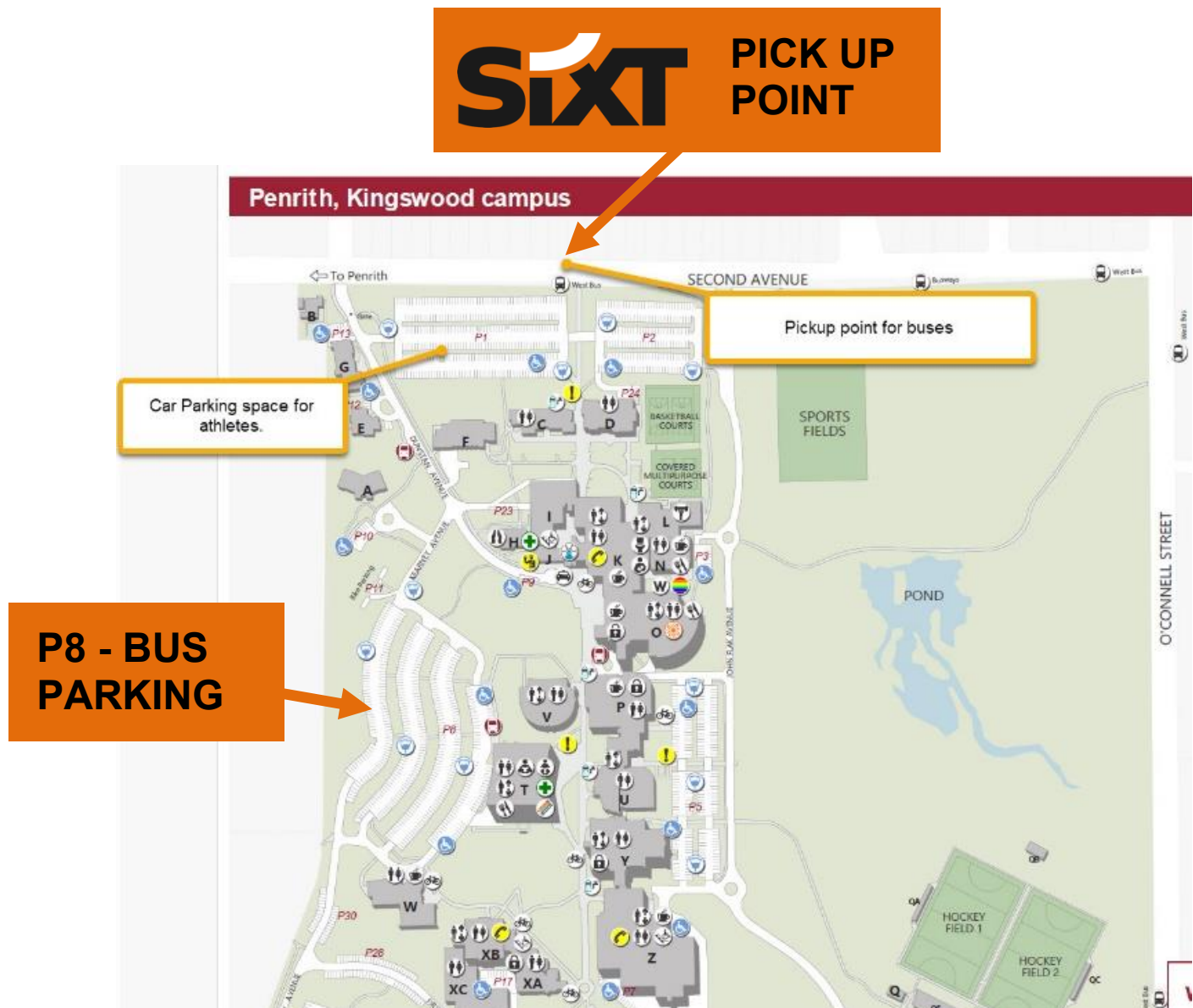
